

Tips for Searching

Keyword Search

The Keyword Search button allows you to perform a general search across multiple felds for any catalog records online. Keyword searches use OR as the default connector between words (e.g. a search for Handy Ranch will return incords associated with Hanky OR Arach). If you want to find records where both keywords are found, type in AND between the two words. To search for a specific phrase, be sure to put the phrase within quotes (e.g. "Rocky Pine Ranch"). You can also use the asterisk (*) as a wildcard (e.g. a search for histor' would come up with records containing history. Nationes, histories, histories,



Growth in property history research

- Driven by home sales
- More difficult than family history
- FHS well-equipped to respond
 - Proven research methodology
 - Familiar with resources and tools
 - Unique resources at Museum
 - Online access to public resources

FHS has been reconstructing the narrative for Falmouth homes one by one





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New Business

Today each request starts from scratch

- Begins with by gathering data from separate databases or files
- A process ripe for streamlining
 - Build a database starting with the older homes
 - Base on the extract from the assessor's database
 - Add data from the binders, the GPL survey, and completed property histories (if done)
- Goal is to have a central repository

Sump Failure

- Electrical failure (GFCI breaker)
- Sump pump failure
 - In service for less than two years
 - Should be covered by warranty
- Possible sump wall fracture
- Well overflowed
- Sump Well Overflow
 - ServiceMaster pumped out water
 - Left temporary pump
 - Still overflowing but not as severely

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
New Business

Root problem is terrain

- Original soil condition unknown but believed to be marshy
- Area excavated for basement
- Surrounding area filled with soil and a lot of rocks
- Subsequent nearby modifications

Falmouth Heritage Museum

• Increase in volume of water entering sump well



Museum seems to be atop an underground stream



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New Business

Need a long-term solution

- Bring in experts with experience solving serious drainage problems
- Have identified two companies
- Solution is likely to be costly
 - Well-defined and urgent expense
 - Good candidate for a grant




